Year 3 Learning Journey



French:

This term we will start by learning days of the week and continuing numbers to 31. This will lead into learning about months of the year and being able to say when our birthdays are. Lastly, we will learn about items in the classroom and in your pencil case.



Science:

During the summer term, we will be looking at forces and magnets, as well as the human body and healthy eating. We will investigate the push and pull forces and look at properties of magnets and magnetic materials.

Later on, we will discuss the elements of a healthy meal and how the human body is structured.



PE:

During the summer term, we will start looking at all the different types of discipline within athletics including a variety of track and field events. We will learn to sprint a distance of up to 60 metres and we will practise conserving energy in order to sustain performance in longer running events.

We will then start to look at summer team sports like cricket, rounders and tennis. We will aim to develop their hand-eye co-ordination and work as a team to achieve results. We will develop throwing and catching techniques and gradually introduce games and match play.

Music:

This term, the children will be continuing to develop their woodwind skills through the ocarina, in preparation for learning the recorder next year. They are also beginning to look at formal written music alongside the informal method they have been using throughout Year 3 so far, as well as focusing on note length and tone.



Computing:

During the summer term, Year 3 pupils will be studying Information Technology. They will be using Word and drawing software programs to investigate and create their own pictures and dreamscapes. They will learn how to collect, combine and manipulate text, graphics and images using a variety of different tools. They will analyse and evaluate the successfulness of their work suggesting improvements that could be made.



RE:

In RE we will continue to develop our understanding of Christianity. We will look at moral dilemmas and how Christians solve them. We will continue to learn more about who Jesus was and what he said, taking into account other points of view as well as including our own opinions.



RSHE:

We will be talking and learning about how we have changed since we were born. We will discuss things we can do now that we couldn't when we were smaller and learning that not all families are the same but all families give us support in different ways.
