Our Year 3 children have now completed their first full term at Two Mile Ash. What a fun term we have all had. We have made lots of new friends, got to know our way around the school and worked hard to earn lots of merit's. Well done Year 3! Within Learning Journey, we have continued to learn about the Stone Age people and our focus has turned to some of the most famous archaeological sites that teach us more about this time period. We have learned all about Skara Brae (a village of houses from the Neolithic times that have been discovered in the Orkney Islands) and the mystery around what Stonehenge was used for. We have come up with some brilliant theories, such as: it being used to scare off predators; a landmark designed by the Stone Age people for us to remember them by or even for discos, due to the position of the stones providing a great sound system. We opened the Year 3 Stone age museum to parents and thank you to all that came and visited.

In science we have been learning about the qualities and types of rocks and different light sources. Our class read for this term has been 'The Great Cave' which we have enjoyed reading together. In personal development, we have learnt all about the Zones of Regulation and what we can do to regulate our feelings. This is something we will continue working on after Christmas.

Our Design and Technology focus has been kites. We made a prototype and then designed, made, tested and evaluated our own kites. It was great fun using the tools and flying our kites outside.

Due to your amazing generosity we earned a phenomenal amount of commission to spend on books.





All children signed up to attend the Young Voices concert on 18th January will receive a letter in the first week detailing the final arrangements for the day. This will include an emergency contact and medical form – we cannot take your child without this information, so please make sure you look out for the letter and return the form by the deadline so we can process everything in time for the visit

If your child is singing at the O2 on 18th January and you haven't done so already, please use this QR code to create a MyClassmate account:

Remember – your parent account will not have access to the music, but it will give you a code for your child's account, which gives them safe access to all the songs, dance videos and lyrics sheets. Remember to make a note of their code and log out before logging your child back in. We've got loads to learn (and we are not allowed word sheets!) so practising little and often at home will make a huge difference to your child's confidence on the day.




Well done to Basti in Year 3 for climbing mount Tryfan in Wales. He made an amazing poster detailing his trip with some great photos!

New Maths Certificates coming to TMA!

At Two Mile Ash we have many ways to celebrate a wide variety of achievements from merits and merit certificates to Read to Succeed and Student of the Week.

Now we would like to build on this by introducing a new series of certificates across the school based on knowing and applying times tables facts.

There are 15 brand new certificates to work towards in two tiers – "Times Tables" certificates and "Fluency with Tables" certificates. The first tier has 6 certificates and will be awarded for learning their times tables:

Times Tables Certificates

Certificate 1 - 2, 5 and 10 times tables

Certificate 2 - 3 and 4 times tables

Certificate 3 - 8 times tables

Certificate 4 - 6 and 7 times tables

Certificate 5 – 9, 11 and 12 times tables

Certificate 6 - Mixed tables

The second tier has a further 9 certificates and will be awarded for using times tables to help with other areas of maths:

Fluency with Tables Certificates

Level 1 - Mixed division facts

Level 2 - Digits 1-12 x10, x100, x1000

Level 3 – Decimal number bonds to 1 (10ths column)

Level 4 – 4 digits ÷10, ÷100, ÷1000

Level 5 - Multiples of 10, 100 and 1000 to 12

Level 6 - Squares and Square roots

Level 7 - Division of 10, 100 and 1000 to 12

Level 8 - Cube and cube roots

Level 9 – Decimal number bonds to 1 (100ths column)

All children across the school are now beginning to work towards these certificates and we are excited to find out who will be the first few children in each year group to receive one!

Teachers will be building in time within their maths lessons to practice these skills but it is also something that can be practiced at home by:

- Encouraging your child to use TTRockstars daily
- Playing games and quizzes linked to your tables
- Singing their "rolling numbers" (there are videos on the website for this)

All the new practice booklets and certificate examples will be on the TMA website shortly, so feel free to have a go at home.

Good luck to everyone and we hope to announce the first few children to receive these certificates very soon!
