
With the MK Schools Gymnastics



British Values



We recently celebrated British Values, with all our classes enjoying a day learning about democracy, rule of law, respect, tolerance and individual liberty. In 6BC, the children presented a speech in which they told their classes what they would do if they were Prime Minister.





Year 3

For our science topic this year, Year 3's have been studying plants. In our most recent experiment, we have been looking at the parts of plants, particularly how water and nutrients are transported around. We started by each of us having a little bit of celery and dissecting it to find the part that lets celery transport the water and nutrients. We found out that xylem tubes are in celery and we located these in our dissection. The teachers used digital microscopes to zoom in closely to see these on the interactive whiteboards.

After we had identified how water and nutrients were transported, we used celery and dyed water to see whether or not the coloured water will travel up the xylem tubes and into the celery. We have been checking up on the celery each day and are eagerly hoping to see the dye in the celery's xylem tubes after 1 week of soaking!







Homework Winners!

Well done to all of the children who took part in our Read to Succeed activity. The task asked the pupils to use either the extract from, 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe' by C.S. Lewis or, 'Scrooge' by Charles Dickens to create the character described. They were also given the alternative option to choose to draw or create another winter character from a book that they had read. The children whose work was selected chose a book from our, 'Wardrobe of Wonder'. All the children who participated received two merits to add to their Passport to Success.

Check out the photos of the topic work where Year 6 have been learning about volcanoes around the world and also the impact of these.


