





The children loved sharing their private rooms, devoured the excellent food and had a thoroughly fun time throughout.

Overall, your children were a credit to the school and without exception made the school proud with their enthusiasm, humour and conduct. They were amazing company and the visit emulated perfectly the year groups behaviours and personalities shown at school since the start of Year 4.

Back in school we ended our Conquerors of Britain history topic with a day of Viking activities hosted by a visiting workshop. This was a hugely engaging and interactive day that the children enjoyed being a part of. They took part in mock battles, learnt Viking games, looked at Viking artifacts and even voted in a role player Viking parliament quiz. As staff, we definitely enjoyed seeing them in costume!

This penultimate half term sees us move onto our always popular rainforest topic in geography and our English text is the Iron Man. We look forward to our Inspiration Day on the 23rd June (more information to follow). We also had a wonderful day celebrating the coronation, learning about our more famous monarchs from the past and creating our keepsakes out of fabric wool and the magical ingredient of washing fragrance booster pellets!


Ramin Delivers A Speech
