Year 3

In our science lessons, we've been talking about how important it is to eat a healthy and balanced diet. We've learned about the different types of food that give our bodies the energy and nutrients they need. The children have enjoyed discovering new foods and understanding how they can keep their bodies strong and healthy.

We've also been exploring the amazing world inside our bodies. We've learned about bones, which give our bodies structure and help us move, and muscles, which help us run, jump, and play. The children have had fun discovering how our bodies work and how important it is to take care of them.

In a very special workshop, we had a virtual reality experience, where we travelled back in time to Ancient Egypt! We got to see the magnificent pyramids, walk through temples, and learn about the lives of ancient Egyptians. It was like stepping into a time machine, and the children loved every moment of this exciting adventure!

In our literacy lessons, we've been working on our storytelling skills. We read a fantastic book called "Ottoline and the Yellow Cat" and used it as inspiration to write our own mystery stories. Children have been letting their imaginations run wild as they create thrilling tales with interesting characters, mysterious settings, and surprising twists. It's been wonderful to see their creativity shine through their writing!

We are so proud of our Year 3 students and their enthusiasm for learning. The team here in Year 3 hopes all of the children have enjoyed their first year here at TMA and wish them a restful and fun summer holiday!











Year 4

What an amazing year it has been for us in Year 4 and as with all good things they go quickly and end too soon! We have finished with a flourish, enjoying Mayan Day activities and learning all about their culture to support our Rainforests topic. The children have really enjoyed the topic and particularly looking at deforestation and the effects it is having on our planet. They have shown real interest and engagement regarding this important issue.

To support our topic further, we painted tigers in the jungle (inspired by Henri Rousseau) and sketched natural items. In D.T., we made environmental message cards linking our circuit knowledge from our science topic. The children used a power source and copper tape to create an open and closed circuit to light a bulb.

In English, we have created video diaries and reports on the rainforests and linked this to a poetry topic too. We also had a very successful final assessment week with our year group improving attainment in all areas.

As the year draws to an end, I want to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support over the past year. It has been highly enjoyable and rewarding for us all and this is as a direct result of your wonderful children.

Modeshift Stars

Throughout this academic year we have been working hard as a school to achieve Modeshift Stars Schools
Accreditation. This scheme recognises schools that show excellence in supporting cycling, walking and other forms of sustainable travel. As a school, Two Mile Ash have devised a Travel Plan and recorded initiatives that have taken place this year. We have submitted our application in July with the hope of gaining our first aim - Bronze Award. We would like to thank parents, pupils, staff as well as MK Council for their support in this ongoing journey to develop healthier, safer habits of travel to and from school in our community. Here are some of the initiatives we have completed this year:







1. Bikeability Cycling Training.

125 Year 5 & 6 pupils completed their Level 2 Bikeability courses in 2022/23, with many of these completing it twice! 19 of these children then went on to represent the school at the MK Bikeability Olympics organised by Cycle Citizens MK - gaining 3rd Place at the Finals!

2. Bike Racks and Scooter Pod installation.

Thanks to a successful £5000 MK Council travel grant application in 2022, we were able to fund the installation of new bike racks to safely secure up to 48 bikes and scooter pods for up to 11 scooters. These were installed over the Easter holidays in 2023.

3. Walk to School Week (15th May).

Children encouraged to travel actively to school every day of the week. Year 3 & 4 pupils collected stickers and filled in active diaries to win prizes. Parents and children encouraged to try 'park & stride' or use of public transport to reduce congestion and encourage walking to school!

4. Happy Shoesday (16th May).

Children and grown-ups encouraged to wear shoes that make them happiest! We raised £100 through donations from families – this has gone towards initiatives in 2023/24.

5. Walking Bubbles.

Images of 5- and 10-minute walking bubbles from TMA School shared on social media. Plans for images in the community to support this will be embedded in 2023/24.

6. Bike Week (6th June).

Our bike shed has been overflowing in the Summer Term! We counted 77 bikes and 19 scooters on one morning!

7. 'Pedal for Prizes'.

Lots of children have found colourful padlocks on their bike and won prizes including pencils, reflective clips and bike lights.

8. Clean Air Day (15th June)

Promotional materials shared online to encourage sustainable travel with the aim to reduce air pollution in our community.





A fantastic year of PE and School Sport concludes, and we are proud of all children at Two Mile Ash for their hard work and dedication. We are also very thankful for the amazing parent and staff support we receive. Whilst we have enjoyed many achievements in both Milton Keynes and Buckinghamshire County events this year, it is the volume of opportunities and the number of pupils we have represent the school that fills us with most delight. Over 150 events (school and house) have been accessed by pupils this academic year, with a total of 555 (83%) of pupils representing TMA in a sport fixture and 491 (73%) representing their house in at least one sport competition. On top of this many of our pupils have accessed regular sports clubs and practices both during lunchtimes and after-school.

Cricket

A huge well done to our Year 5/6 Cricketers at their MK Schools Dynamos Cricket Competitions at Bletchley CC in June. A cumulative 9 wins out of 10 matches from both teams - a remarkable achievement! As a result of this success, we represented Milton Keynes at the County Cricket Finals at Chearsley Cricket Club on Tuesday 11th July. Following two impressive wins in our group and the semi-finals, we came up just short in the Final against a very good side from Ickford School. County Runners up - a fantastic achievement, well done to all of you! Kian named TMA star player for the tournament - excellent leader and player, well deserved!

The children and staff at TMA have enjoyed learning all about Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and how accepting and celebrating these elements, give us all a sense of belonging. The children have embraced learning about neurodiversity, race, beliefs, gender and culture and have loved sharing their own experiences and what makes them unique!

Year 5

Year 5 have had a fantastic term learning all about water worlds! We have taken time to reflect on our learning and hard work and as a result we have been really impressed with the determination showed across all 5 classes.

We have had a real push on reading in order to prepare our Year 5's for the year ahead and the ownership and responsibility taken to bringing in their reading records daily has been just fantastic. Well done Year 5. Reading is so important for vocabulary acquisition, and it has been a pleasure to hear of the new vocabulary children are learning as they read more and more challenging texts. It has also been a pleasure to introduce our new magical class read 'The Mask of Aribella' which is set in Venice, Italy. We have discussed the magical powers we would like to have if were lucky enough to go and lived in the magical organisation described in the text.

A particular highlight this term has been our life cycles topic. Each class became home to 5 butterflies that grew from caterpillars. It was amazing to see the caterpillars begin to spin webs almost like spiders to make their cocoons and some classes actually got to see the butterflies emerge mid lesson! I think it gave our teachers quite the surprise! Having kept the butterflies for a few days and fed them naturally sugary fruit, we set them free from the classroom being careful as they really were very delicate.

The other area of the curriculum where we have learned more about water has been geography and art. In geography, we have investigated local rivers and rivers across the world. Watching the children present the facts they have learned has been brilliant and their confidence when speaking publicly has definitely grown. In art, we have been inspired by Dale Chihuly and his glass sculptures, mimicking his technique with plastic water bottles (a much safer alternative) and carefully using markers to design our translucent patterns delicately. We have also used watercolours to reimagine Hokusai's wave at sunset and listening to the children confidently compliment each other on their artwork has been a pleasure.

As the year draws to a close we are very proud of all our Year 5's have achieved this year.

Award For Krishvi


