


Year 3 have had a very exciting start to the year at TMA!

A group of Year 6's have also enjoyed Leadership sessions at lunchtimes – skills they will put into place later in the year at school Cricket events.

If you want to play and learn more about Cricket, there are FREE Street Cricket sessions locally at Radcliffe School (Saturdays 1:45pm-3:15pm) and at Leon Leisure Centre, Bletchley (Mondays 5:30pm-6:30pm) for Boys and Girls aged 8-15. Additionally, there is a Girls (aged 8-15) only session each week at Bletchley Leisure Centre from 6pm-7:30pm. No equipment needed – just wear sports clothing!









Swimming at TMA

We are getting very excited for the arrival of a temporary swimming pool being set up at Two Mile Ash School over half-term to provide this opportunity for our pupils to access swimming. Sporty Scholars, in association with Elite Swimming, run a unique Pools to Schools programme, providing an experienced, qualified Swimming Instructor. In addition, a Lifeguard is on duty at all times to ensure the safety of children. The pool is set up in a covered, secured marquee and heated between 26-32 degrees Celsius.



Free swimming sessions have been organised for ALL Year 4 & 5 pupils, as well as for some groups of Year 6's! Lessons in school time start on the week commencing Monday 20th November 2023. In addition to swimming lessons in school, there has been the opportunity for pupils to sign-up to after-school extra-curricular swimming sessions. These start straight after half-term! Swimming sessions and clubs end week commencing Monday 11th December 2023.

A timetable for Year 4 & 5 swimming lessons has been scheduled in line with children's PE days. For a morning lesson, they should come to school 'swim ready' with their swimming costume / swimming shorts on under their PE Kit. For an afternoon lesson, they should bring their swimming costume / swimming shorts into school in a named bag. They will be given time to then change using our school changing rooms before the lesson.


Headteacher's Awards

The children were so excited to watch the videos and it was such a treat to watch them pass the headphones to one another so they could hear them speak their lines on the video. We used the green screen so the children could give their weather warnings to the men on the ship! We would like to say a huge thank you to Mr H for helping us video our recordings and Mia P who completed work experience at Two Mile Ash and supported to edit the video clips. It is lovely to see what we can achieve when we work together! Miss Baldwin, Miss Norman and Mr H then accompanied the children on a tour of the gallery where we saw paintings of Whistle Jacket by Stubbs, Surprise by Henri Rousseau, Men of the Docks by Bellows, The Umbrellas by Renoir and An Experiment on a bird in a bell jar by Joseph Wright to name a few. These are all previous or upcoming Take One Picture paintings and the children were quick to point out how many had been painted by male artists!! We had a lovely walk through Trafalgar Square, St James' Park and up through Westminster before hopping back on the tube and taking the train home. We have our Take One Picture arts days coming up where every child will have the opportunity to partake in art across the two days and we know from our previous success, this truly is such an exciting opportunity! 







Hello and welcome to Year 5.





The children have been really enjoying learning about our geography topic of aquatic biomes, in which they have been studying freshwater and salt-water biomes. The children have studied the water cycle and created their own diagrams. In PSHE, the children have been looking at a programme called Jigsaw, in which they came up with and drafted their own learning charters! In our science topic of 'Materials, Year 5 had the opportunity to use their knowledge to come up with a design for a new house.

Year 5 also had a great time on our walk to Lodge Lake with the Parks Trust, where they learnt all about the local freshwater biome and conducted some field observations.


















We have had a fantastic start to the year in Year 6 and we couldn't be more proud of our pupils and the work they have produced already! We have begun our history topic 'World at War' and there have been some fantastic pieces of work summarising the knowledge the children have acquired and vocabulary they are now confident using. We have studied the countries and alliances in WWI and WWII and even linked our learning to black history month studying the life of Walter Tull – a famous footballer. This has also supported the children's understanding in English and their application of their understanding of life in the trenches to a diary entry. We have been so impressed with the figurative language and devices the children have persevered to use and it has been lovely to share this writing together. We are now reading Private Peaceful as our class read and The Boy in Striped Pyjamas in English, inferring deeper meaning about the themes, characters and settings of the book. We have also applied our understanding of the war in Art drawing soldiers in proportion and in poses that soldiers would have used. We have used watercolour washes to reflect the different moods of war and replicated the techniques of Henry Moore and Barbara Hepworth too. We had a great trip to Wolverton Museum in the final week of the half term and know this hands on experience of different activities will support our children's understanding of life in the war years.

Well done for settling into Year 6 so well.
