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1:1 iPad initiative

- All children from Year 2 and up will have their own iPad to be used at school and at home.
- EYFS and Year 1 will have access to shared iPads for use at school.

Lightspeed is our preferred partner for filtering, monitoring, and alerting and is used when accessing the internet.

It has been configured in conjunction with the IFtL safeguarding team, the IT department, and Lightspeed. It ensures compliance with the latest statutory guidance from KCSIE 2023.



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Device management

The iPads are managed remotely using a Remote Device Management System. This provides us with the tools we need to manage settings and configurations, and to make changes quickly and efficiently.

For example, we can install apps and updates, restrict access to apps or settings, lock the device, and identify times when the devices should be inoperable i.e. only the clock appears, for example.

The settings have been preconfigured and tested prior to children receiving their device.

Screen Time

Maintaining a healthy balance



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Device usage

A schedule is being carefully designed to ensure access to the device during appropriate times, but also specific times where the device is inoperable so that a healthy balance can be maintained.

For example,

- Monday to Saturday the devices to be operable between 8.00am and 7pm.
- No access to the device on Sundays.

School holidays

Device operable between 8.30 and 3.30pm.



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JAMF Parent

The **Jamf Parent** app extends the power of MDM to provide management controls for parents. This means parents can limit apps and device functionality on their children's devices.

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Expectations to support your child's learning journey with an iPad.

Engage regularly in conversation and discussion about what your child has been using their iPad for.

Practical conversations around the effective use of the device, including the appropriate use of the internet, managing screen time, and developing healthy boundaries will be essential.

Maintaining a collaborative partnership between school and home will ensure we make this initiative a success. Understanding that technology, and the internet, is always evolving and we need to be open to and reactive to new developments.

The iPad needs to be charged ready for school each day.



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Support

- We will be sharing ‘How-to’ guides and video tutorials for you on everything from the basics of using the iPad to how you can get involved in your child’s learning.
- Educating the children on the importance of screen time, boundaries, and healthy technology choices is something we will do together.
- Dialogue between school and home is key.

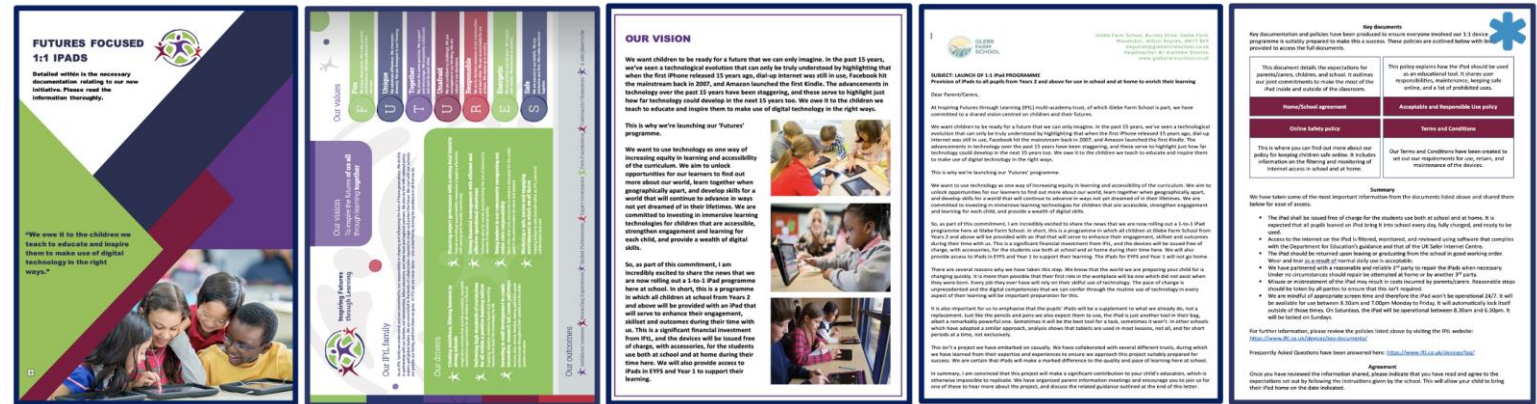
- We have all worked with children for a long time and we are realistic and reasonable when it comes to our expectations for the use of the iPad
