For our science topic this term, Year 3's have been studying plants. In our most recent experiment, we have been looking at the parts of plants, particularly how water and nutrients are transported around. We started by each of us having a little bit of celery and dissecting it to find the part that lets celery transport the water and nutrients. The teachers used digital microscopes to zoom in closely to see these on the interactive whiteboards. After we had identified how water and nutrients were transported, we used celery and dyed water to see whether or not the coloured water will travel up the *xylem* tubes and into the celery. We have been checking up on the celery each day and we can finally see the dye in the celery tubes!



We have also been very busy with our DT project. Each class has researched and baked thier very own fruit tarts, which were thendevoured for a taste test! We hope you all have a restful half-term.




As we move into the Spring Two term, Year 5 pupils are really looking forward to our next

This term we have been so busy in Year 6. We are so impressed by the maturity with which children have taken to their learning and the quality of work being produced is excellent! In our foundation curriculum subjects, we have been applying our knowledge in different ways and recording research and ideas with more detail and personal style. In History, we have been researching life through the decades ,considering carefully how the population has grown and changed over time, we have also researched the development of transport, communication and cinema through time.

In Art, we have studied art through the centuries before using our 1:1 devices to develop our own artistic interpretation of gem stones. We have photographed gems on a variety of different papers to experiment with tone and texture. Then we used the editing settings to develop the photographs using brightness, exposure, brilliance, highlights and the shadow tool. In our sketch books we have developed sketches before applying wax crayon to show both colour and shine before developing these images artistically in both Showbie and Keynote. It really has challenged us to use technology in different ways!

In English, we have been learning about the Titanic, writing descriptive scenes of boarding the ship, persuasive texts to encourage passengers to board and information texts too. In book club, we have been learning about authors from different backgrounds and texts set at different points in history. We are enjoying our latest class read, Windrush Child, written by Benjamin Zephaniah and children are growing in confidence to read aloud in front of their peers. In French, we have been using our linguistic skills to develop confidence in speaking aloud. We are describing our family members in detail using different adjectives to describe both physical features and personalities. Another success has been mock SATs, where all our children were motivated to show their working as best as they could. The feel around Year 6 was one of concentration and determination and as a team we are so proud of all the children have achieved.
